Operation Christmas Child Good News, Great Joy

In November we will again be filling the shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. This is a nondenominational evangelical Christian organization providing spiritual and physical aid to hurting people around the world. These boxes offer help and hope in Jesus' name.

Boxes are filled with Love, hygiene items, school supplies, toys and the Good News of Jesus Christ shared through Operation Christmas Child.

Now is a great time to begin collecting items for the Shoeboxes (buying items during <u>Back to School sales</u> helps spread your money further and helps you to buy more items). Boxes are packed by age; Boy 2-4 Years Old, Boy 5-9 Years Old, Boy 10-14 Years Old and Girl 2-4 Years Old, Girl 5-9 Years Old, Girl 10-14 Years Old. It would be great if each box had a WOW Item. WOW items could be small plush animals (it would be nice if *every* box had a huggable plush toy – even for the older girls and boys!), dolls, toys, games, craft kits, model kits, tools, etc.

Boxes are also filled with grooming and hygiene items. These could be toothbrush, comb, brush, hair accessories, mild soap (not highly scented), bandages, tissues, lip balm, fingernail/manicure sets (no polish), wash cloth, water bottles, socks, t-shirts, underwear, etc. and any other ideas you think of!

Ideas for girls; travel sewing kit, fabric, bracelets, clip-on earrings, doll, purse, unbreakable hand mirror/compact, hair ribbons, ponytail holders, barrettes, crafting kits (beads, etc.), toys, etc. and any other ideas you think of!

Ideas for boys; ball cap, soccer ball with pump, balls, cars, trucks, compass, (hammer, nails, screwdrivers, screws – in original packaging), tool kits, LED keychain, duct tape, tape measure, toys, etc. and any other ideas you think of!

Ideas for all ages; pens, pencils, pencil sharpeners, colored pencils, markers, 24 package of crayons, erasers, scissors, sunglasses, socks, flip flops, water shoes, clothes, jigsaw puzzles, finger puppets, silly putty, scarves, bandanas, shoelaces, bean bags, hacky sack, flashlights, harmonicas, kazoos, Legos, jump ropes, yo-yo's, slinky, solar calculators, coloring books, picture books, etc. and any other ideas you think of! Stop by the Mission and Outreach table to get a list of ideas.

Remember we can't send these items: toothpaste, liquids, war-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures), chocolate, food, lotion, medicine, vitamins, breakable glass, aerosol cans, electrical items, money, used items and oversized items (everything needs to fit in a shoebox).

If you don't want to shop but want to be part of the excitement of Operation Christmas Child you can donate money that will be used to purchase items to complete boxes that are missing items. Delivering the shoe boxes overseas is costly, you may want to consider donating money to help (it costs \$10 per box to cover project costs involved in collecting, processing, and shipping your shoebox gifts to over 100 countries).
