First UMC Continues Ministry to Those in Need of Food

Partnering with New Harvest and Turning Point in Utica

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Deacon Becky Guthrie has joined with New Harvest, a United Methodist New Faith Community in Utica, and Turning Point, a non-denominational church which is now worshiping in the former Asbury UMC church building on Rutger Street in Utica, to provide food assistance to folks in the Utica area. Each Thursday, volunteers wearing face masks gather at the Turning Point church. Lunches are

prepared and delivered within a four-block radius of turning Point, as well as Kennedy Plaza Apartments in Utica, and in the area surrounding the Neighborhood Center, where New Harvest was meeting for worship prior to the pandemic. Currently there are 330 lunches delivered. Initially, volunteers canvased the neighborhood to see who was in need of lunch being delivered. Through word of mouth, the response has grown each week. Now the food ministry is ready to move into a new phase of distribution for the summer. Those who want to receive a lunch will be asked to pick up lunches at Turning Point Church. This will help give a chance to take the connection with the community to a new level as well as invite those receiving food to connect to the church and receive spiritual food also.

Though Deacon Becky is volunteering at this time, others from First UMC are asked to pray for the food ministry and offer financial support, if they feel God's leading to give. (See p. 2)

Deacon Becky Guthrie and First UMC of New Hartford are partnering with New Harvest New Faith Community and Turning Point Church on Rutger Street in Utica to provide a free weekly lunch to those in the areas around the churches. Prayers and financial support are most welcome at this time.

Church Council Weighs Reopening of In-Person Worship

As New York State has entered Phase 4 of NY Forward, many are wondering what the plan is for church. This is not a short and easy answer. There are many guidelines in place for in-person worship to resume, both from New York State and The Upper New York Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church, which encompasses our local First United Methodist Church in New Hartford.

Some of the guidelines include: deep cleaning, social distancing of six feet or more; wearing masks; removing extra furniture, hymnals and Bibles from common areas; signage; hand sanitizing stations; monitoring attendance for contact tracing; and limiting the number of people to reduce capacity. So far, our church's custodian, Jonathan Panzone, has been carefully cleaning every inch of the church thoroughly and removing extra items from common spaces. Signage on masks, safety procedures and hygiene are posted.

At the June 25th Church Council meeting, the Council voted overwhelmingly to not open to in-person worship at this time because it is not safe to do so. The health and safety of all attendees, especially those who are considered vulnerable due to age or other medical conditions, is the most important factor in this decision. There is also concern among some Council Members that attending worship with social distancing and wearing masks, as well as no singing, will not be the type of worship experience folks are used to and is of a lower quality than is already being provided through online worship. Finally, there is fear among Council Members that there will be those attending worship who will not adhere to the safety guidelines and put others at risk for contracting COVID-19.

The Council has agreed to revisit the state of the pandemic in one month and see if it is safe to reopen in-person worship. Please know that we love and care about each person and miss you. Please join in online worship opportunities and stay connected through telephone, cards and online communication. We are 100 percent certain God will see us through this challenging time.
