Ash Wednesday Begins Season of Lent

All are welcome to take part in Ash Wednesday worship 6:30 p.m., March 2.

This special service begins the season of Lent. The focus of Ash Wednesday is to repent of our sins as we acknowledge our humanity. For those who are willing, a symbol of ashes will be placed on the hand or the forehead. Lent is 40 days long, not counting Sundays, remembering Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness being tempted by Satan. Today Christians use this season as a time to do good works, pray, turn away from sin and grow closer to God as we prepare to celebrate Easter. This year Easter Sunday is April 17, 2022.
